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## **BRIDGE COURSE REPORT**

**OCTOBER 11, 2021 TO OCTOBER 16, 2021**

Department of Law, Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Management Studies conducted a Bridge Course for the students of BALLB First Semester Session (2020-2021) from October 11, 2021 to October 16, 2021 under the Coordinatorship of Dr. Nirdosh Kumar. This was a maiden initiative of the department to bridge the gap between subjects studied at Senior Secondary level and the subjects they would be studying in BALLB. The Bridge Course was conducted before commencement of the classes of BALLB in five subjects i.e. Sociology, History, Political Science, Economics and Legal English. The Resource persons for aforementioned subjects were Dr. Nirdosh Kumar, Dr. Anuradha Asthana Singh, Dr. Vinay Kumar Bhatnagar, Ms. Ritika Bhatia and Ms. Saumya Sharma respectively. Besides, a SCC Online session and Bridge Course Exam were conducted on Saturday, October 16, 2021 in online mode. The resource person for SCC Online session was Mr. Chetan Singh Gill, a Master Trainer and Sr. Manager Training at SCC Online.

The duration of the Course was 6 days (One Week) with 24 hours (20 hours for delivery of Course Curriculum, 2 hours for SCC online, 2 hours for Exam). The classes of Bridge Course were conducted in offline mode. Total 74 students of BALLB attended the course.

The content of the course was designed separately for each subject keeping course curriculum of BALLB in the focus. During the period (20 hours) above mentioned subjects were taught and tried to make the students understand about basic of each subject. Apart from this, an online session of Two hours was conducted on using SCC Online services. Besides, an online test of Two hours (50 MCQ Question) was conducted to measure performance and level (Slow/Advanced) of the students. After completion of the course, a feedback form was shared with the students to get their views on content taught in each subjects, and on subject knowledge, presentation quality, and communication skills of the resource persons.

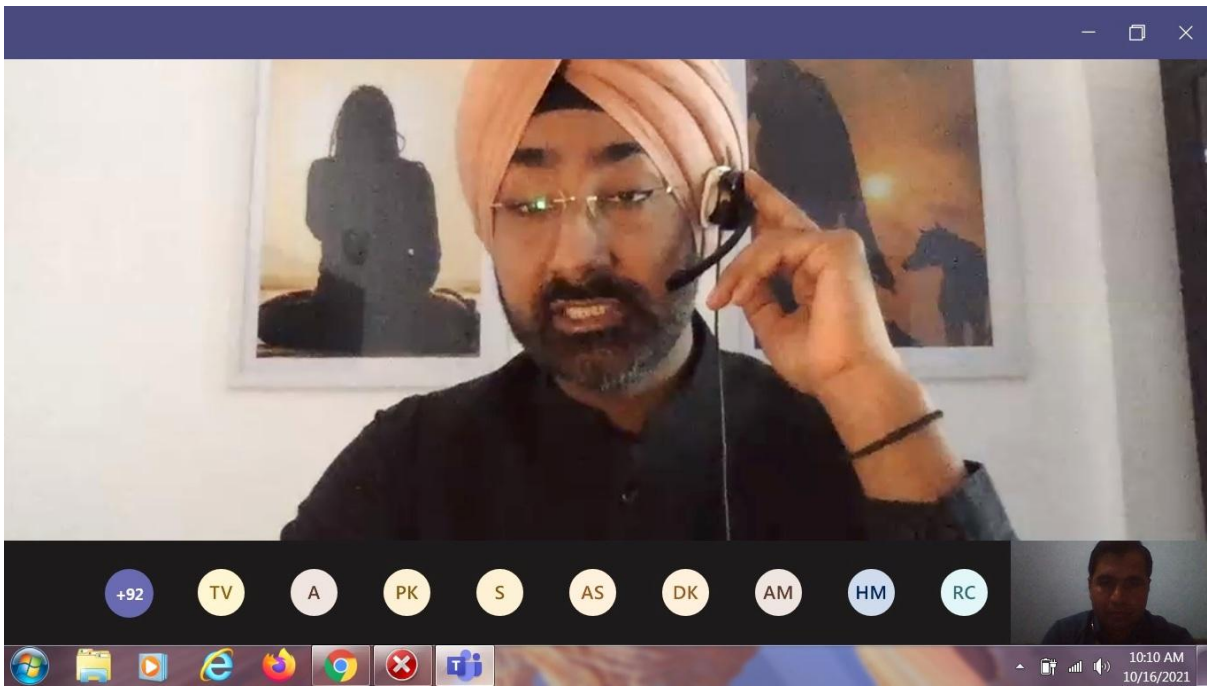


Figure 3: SCC Online Session by Chetan Singh Gill on Saturday, October 16, 2021

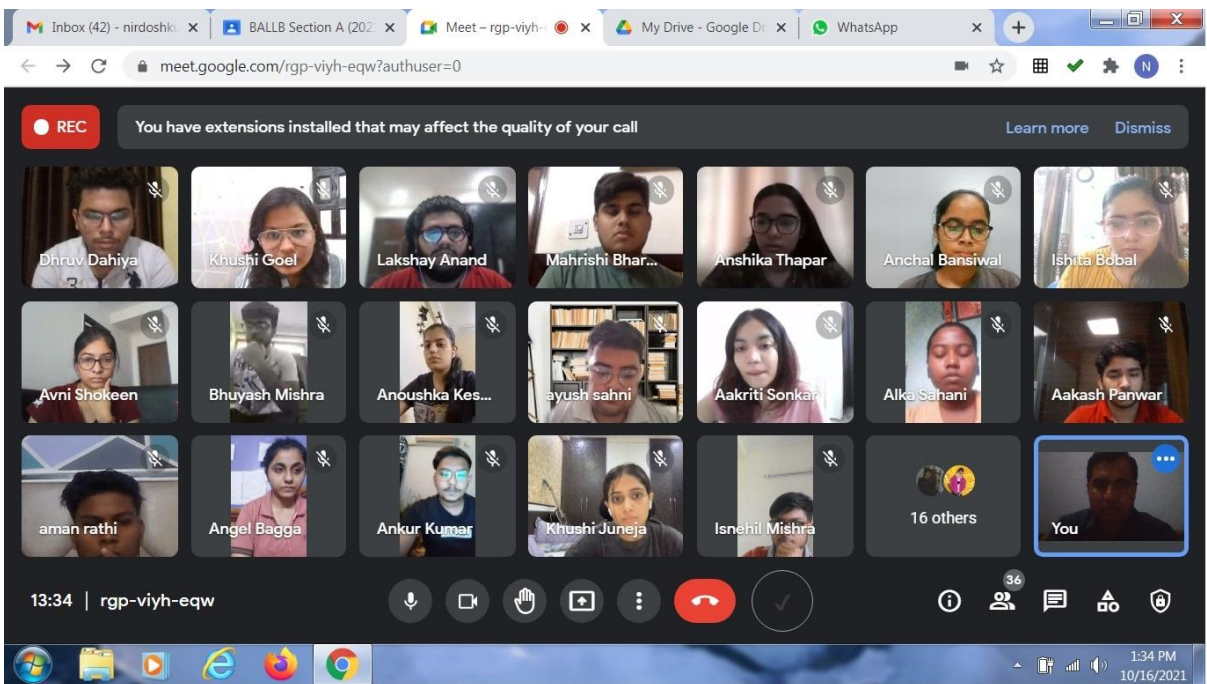


Figure 4: Bridge Course Exam
