With the active participation of the villagers, the team of 24 students led by Ms. Sanam Sharma & Ms. Anu Goyal, Department of Business Administration, MAIMS, met the representatives from the village and discussed the ongoing initiatives. They also enquired suggestions from inhabitants for improving the condition of the village.

To substantiate this, a team of faculties and students did primary data collection using prescribed Questionnaires and Interviews. The team successfully collected **194 responses** from the households. It was a great exposure & opportunity for the students and faculties to understand the need of the villagers and their requirements. From this survey, Faculties and students of Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Management studies, have tried visualizing their needs and exploring the possibilities of customizing it with existing technologies. The institute is preparing an action plan for the villagers to enrich rural life, and is in process of implementation of the action plan in coordination with local administration and other stakeholders.
