Report for an Excursion cum Industrial Visit to Jaipur

Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Management Studies, Department of Economics organised a three days excursion cum industrial visit to Jaipur, Rajasthan. There was a total of 65 students accompanied by 5 faculty members to this visit. The cost for the visit was Rs 4500 per person which included travelling, hotel expenses as well as dinner at Chowki Dhani.

As decided priorly, there were two pick up points in Delhi- Rohini east metro station and Dhaura Kuan metro station. The bus started for Jaipur on 5th March 2022 early in the morning around 6:30 AM. Then it went to Dhaura Kuan and picked rest of the students. Finally the bus left directly for the first destination 'The Bhangarh Fort', which is 'The Most Haunted Place in India'. It was a drive of approximately 6-7 hours from Delhi. The Bus Journey was enjoyed by the students. An hour before reaching the fort, Dr. Sanjay Kumar Mangla, Head, Department of Economics, MAIMS told students the ancient history about the fort and why it is the most haunted place. Around 3:00 PM the bus reached Bhangarh fort. Everyone stayed over there for around 2 hours and explored about the history of the fort. From Bhangarh fort, the bus left for hotel "Nahargarh Haveli". After having rest for about an hour, everyone came to hotel terrace for dinner and DJ night. DJ night was a fun night for all the students and faculty members. After that all students were instructed to move towards their respective rooms to retire for the day and to start the second day with full excitement and an enthusiasm to explore the capital city of Rajasthan.





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The second day in the pink city 'Jaipur' started with an amazing breakfast in the hotel itself. After having breakfast, everyone boarded the Bus and journey was started towards the historic fort of Nahargarh. A very experienced guide was appointed who shared his knowledge of this prestigious city with all students. While having all these conservations, all students enjoyed the 2-hour bus drive to the Nahargarh fort. Around 11:00 AM, everyone reached the fort and were amazed to see the architecture work of ancient India. The whole fort was well designed and was really a great symbol of the artwork of the ancient India. Nahargarh fort is a centre of amazing art work of both ancient as well as modern India. It has the World's first ever wax museum with audio story narration. It had wax statues of not only great personalities of India but from all over the world as well. It was a very amazing experience and everyone were struck to see the beautiful architect there. As everyone came out from the museum, they were asked to wait for their turn to move to the next place. This boring wait was soon turned to not so boring one as students were soon introduced to the folk culture of the Rajasthan popularly known as 'The puppet show'. In a span of around half an hour, all students moved towards the amazing and incredible piece of artwork popularly known as 'The Sheesh Mahal'. What an artwork it was! It was completely made up of pieces of the glass. Different colours of pieces of glass represent the different moods of a person. After witnessing two such great artworks, the bus left for the local market of the Jaipur for the fun shopping and tasting the spicy street food of Rajasthan. The local market of Jaipur was full of the handicraft materials made by the local "Banjara" people. All the stuff was handcrafted by the people only. By talking to these people, students came to know about how the prestigious handicraft industry is shrinking in Indian economy. The industry which was once in demand in the international market is now deprived in the domestic market only. Around 6:00 PM, the bus reached back to the hotel, everyone got fresh and got ready to leave for the highlight of our pink city; 'Chokhi Dhani'. There were elephant rides, camel rides, a lot of games, hand reading, tarot cards, henna applying, horror caves, amazing sweet dishes etc. After enjoying this, there was regional buffet dinner which was enjoyed a lot by everyone. It was an urban cum rural experience. Every dish was made with a rural touch including the bajra roti and the kadhi. After enjoying the luxury dinner, everyone came back to our hotel and rested for the night.





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The next day started with getting ready and packing the bag to checkout from the hotel. After doing the last days breakfast at the hotel, the bus left for the Industrial Visit. The bus stopped at the next and one of the most important point of the trip “Pawan creations Ltd.”. It is one of the most well-known and certified textile industry at Sitapur Jaipur. The main objective behind the visit was to make students gain practical industry related knowledge and functioning of the industry. The students were introduced to various sections related to the garment industry like store section where all the fabric is stored and is well maintained through quality control



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measures and embroidery section where the automated embroidery machines were working as per the designs given through software. After spending around an hour in the industry, everyone boarded the bus. The last stop was taken at Highway Kings for having lunch around 2PM. Finally few students took drop at Dhaula Kuan, while others were dropped at the Rohini East Metro Station. All the students and faculty reached back at their places maximum by 10:30 PM.
