## **REPORT OF PARLIAMENTARY VISIT**

Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Management Studies, Department of law organized a visit to the Parliament of India on Friday, 6th January, 2023. This visit was organised for third semester students of BA LLB and BBA LLB, Batch 2021-2026, being a part of PSDA of Constitutional law.

A total number of 52 students were accompanied by the faculty members of the department of Law. Dr V.K Bhatnagar (served on the post of joint secretary in the Lok Sabha), Dr Deepa Kaushik (Convener), Dr Mukesh Kalwani, Ms Preeti Goel and Mr Rakesh Chaurisa, PRO were the accompanying members.

The Parliament of India is the supreme legislative body of the Republic of India. The Parliament is comprised of the President of India and two houses, i.e. Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha. With great zeal and enthusiasm, the students along with the faculty members entered the parliament complex through the parliament house museum gate after completing all the formalities and the group was welcomed by the officials followed by an insightful address by Mr Raj Kumar, Additional Director, PRIDE (Parliament Research And Training Institute For Democracies), who presented a brief introduction about our lawmaking process.

After the brief introduction through the documentary on making of Indian Constitution, the group took memorable photographs on the lawns of the prestigious parliament, proceeded for a guided tour and witnessed the replica of the Constitution of India in the Library of the Parliament. High tea was served in the Parliament's banquet room. Thereafter, the group proceeded to the Lok Sabha Hall, Rajya Sabha Hall and Central Hall (where the Britishers finally handed over power of the nation in 1947, a significant milestone that marked the nation's historic transition to freedom), where the students and faculty took the opportunity of sitting in the public gallery of both houses. The tour guide very efficiently explained the intricacies of different halls and elaborated upon interesting facts about the structures and the galleries to the students. Various queries of the students about the historical and legal aspects were also addressed by the tour guides.

The students expressed their gratitude to Shri V.K. Bhatnagar, faculty members and the management of the Institute for organizing such an enlightening academic visit which helped the students to gain in depth knowledge about the Indian legislative process and functioning of Parliament of India.
