# Faculty Development Program on "Innovative Practices in Teaching, Learning and Research Methods"

Monday, August 6-Friday, 10 August 2018

Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Management Studies Organized a five day Faculty Development Program from 06<sup>th</sup>-10th August 2018 on the theme "Innovative Practices in Teaching, Learning and Research Methods". A total of 55 faculty members from various prominent institutes/ colleges including the Department of Law, Economics, Commerce, Management, Journalism, MAIMS registered for the FDP. The main purpose of the FDP was to upgrade knowledge, analytical skills of the participants and to make them aware about the innovative practices in teaching and learning of the contemporary time.

A total of 12 sessions were conducted by renowned Academician and experts of various fields. The sessions covered under FDP ranged from Research Methodology, Changing Socio-Legal Dimensions of Family and Gender, Law regarding Health Care and Data Protection, Empirical research using SPSS software, Practices of Ancient Education, Teaching and Learning Methods, New Developments in Environmental Law and Policy, Challenges in use of ICT Tools in Teaching and Research and Mental Health Issues.

Day 1 of the FDP comprised of the inaugural ceremony along with the sessions on the topics, "Types of Research, techniques and research design according to recent trends" and "Empirical research using SPSS software" which enlightened the participants about the technical aspects of research, particularly for the participants who did not share similar technical background. Day 2 and 3 were full of sessions which were not merely restricted to research but also gave platform to the participants to discuss contemporary issues such as "The role of women in shaping the next generation of professions" and "Understanding evolving data protection and Privacy Regulations in India." Day 4 and 5 marked the discussions on emerging issues related to society and environment and scope of research therein along with the valedictory session.

The topics were extensively elaborated and queries of the participants were addressed in the end of each session. Various relevant aspects of the topic were emphasized in each discourse.

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The participants gained through illuminating and informative sessions and their doubts were clarified by the resource persons. All the sessions were full of learning and a plethora of knowledge for the participants. It was an extremely fruitful experience from the perspective of learning innovative practices in teaching and research.
