

The Resource Persons, **Prof** (**Dr.**) **Umesh Arya**, *Dean*, *Faculty of Media Studies*, *Guru Jambheshwar University of Science and Technology, Haryana* and **Prof.** (**Dr.**) **Dev Vrat Singh**, *Department of Mass Communication, Central University of Jharkhand, Ranchi*, conducted an interactive Workshop about Statistical Package for the Social Sciences (SPSS) and the many vital topics related to research like Chi-square, ANOVA, Multivariate examination, and much more.

Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Management Studies, Department of Economics organised a three days excursion cum industrial visit to Jaipur, Rajasthan. There was a total of 65 students accompanied by 5 faculty members to this visit. The cost for the visit was Rs 4500 per person which included travelling, hotel expenses as well as dinner at Chowki Dhani.

As decided priorly, there were two pick up points in Delhi-Rohini east metro station and Dhaula Kuan metro station. The bus started for Jaipur on 5th March 2022 early in the morning around 6:30 AM. 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
Session on "Mental Health by Mind peers" February, 2022





The perception has been that technology aids the concentration of economic power and said technology is capital intensive and costly and therefore is in the hands of the owners of capital. And if this leads to concentration of economic power, then it will also lead to all the ills mentioned earlier by Mr. Tulsi namely manipulation, speculation, parasitic destruction, wealth destruction and what we see today is a sort of cannibalistic culture. Ms. Sakshi Gupta invited Ms. Usha Nair to give the concluding remarks on final session of Day 2 of three-day workshop. She expressed her big thanks to all respected speakers.

The third day of the Workshop on "Entrepreneurship as a Pathway to Make India Self-Reliant" equally enlightening and offered a highly learning and interactive experience to the participants. The day started with an introductory session by Dr. Rudresh Pandey, National Co Convenor, KIF & professor, ABES, Ghaziabad. 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
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SESSION ON "HOW TO READ FAST AND EFFECTIVELY" October 6, 2020



Industrial Visit to YAKULT DANONE INDIA PVT. Ltd.

MAIMS always believe in reducing the gap between the industrial demand and academics. An industrial Visit was organized on **28th Feb 2020** for the Students of B.com (H) 1st year along with two faculty members Dr. Deepak Dagar & Mr. Inderpal Singh to YAKULT DANONE INDIA (YAKULT) Rai, Sonipat (Haryana). Yakult Danone India (P) Ltd is a 50:50 JV between Yakult Honsha, Japan and Groupe Danone of France. Yakult has received ISO 9001: 2008, HACCP and OHSAS accreditations for manufacturing a safe and quality product for its consumers.

The students were welcome by their Public Relations officer Mr. Aadish and HR Manager Mr. Ashutosh. The visit begin with the display of various variants of Yakult and their packaging for each country in which they operate. The basic specifications that is modified in the product for each country is number of bacteria in it i.e. the count of Lactobacillus (LCS) is increased or decreased according to the food consumption patterns of that country.

The group was directed towards the seminar hall where the students were shown a presentation based on the history of Yakult , their current operations and marketing strategies. The most promising feature of their company was the concept of 'Yakult Ladies' i.e. the initiative towards women empowerment by giving them employment and a scooter so that they could deliver their product to consumers directly without any middlemen involved in it.

The presentation was followed by a factory orientation tour lead by the PR officer Mr. Aadish. He explained and showed the whole manufacturing and packing process of Yakult from the beginning till the end. The process started with a tank in which powdered milk is converted into pure skimmed milk followed by the sedimentary tanks where the fermentation process took place. They had a very consumer friendly practice of conducting quality checks for each batch of production in their in house laboratory. After the fermentation process, through an assembly line the empty bottles that were produced in the factory itself were filled with automated pipelines and machines. According to Mr. Aadish, theplant had a capacity to produce 10, 00,000 bottles per day but as of now the Indian demand is of 3, 00,000 bottles per day. The process of producing a bottle of Yakult taking around 12-15 days' time.

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The most unique feature that the whole group was surprised to know was that the whole factory of Yakult is managed by only 55 employees including the blue and white collar workers. Also they had only one single plant situated in the Food Park, Rai Industrial Area, Sonipat (Haryana) to cater the whole Indian demand effectively and efficiently.

The visit was a fruitful experience for the students as they learned the processing stages and the latest technology in producing processed products. The students were given cookies and a bottle of Yakult (65 ml). The visit was very informative, knowledgeable and enriching

Industrial Visit Report (Relaxo Footwears Ltd, Bahadurgarh Plant (UnitVIII)

Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Management Studies under the able-leadership of Prof. Ravi Kumar Gupta, Director, MAIMS organized an industrial visit for students of B. Com (H) second semester to Relaxo Footwears Ltd, Bahadurgarh Plant (Unit VIII) on 12 February, 2020. The students were accompanied by two faculty members - Ms. Shilpa B S L, Assistant Professor and Ms. Preeti Bansal, Assistant Professor. The students and the faculty were received at the plant by Mr. Toshit Dhawan (Prod, AGM) and his technical team. Our students got an opportunity to interact with Mr. Verinder Kumar (Vice President, Mfg.) who welcomed them to their facility and spoke about the quality standards maintained at the state-of-the-art manufacturing unit at Bahadurgarh. The technical team of the plant introduced the students, through a power-point presentation, the various manufacturing processes, functioning, and quality procedures adhered to in the making of their polyurethane (PU) footwear range. Following the presentation, the batch of 40 students was divided into groups of two and taken on a tour of the facility accompanied by the production leads. Students made a detailed tour of the Bahadurgarh plant which is a specialized plant to manufacture polyurethane (PU) footwear of the Flite brand of Relaxo Footwear Ltd. During their visit the students were shown various operations in manufacturing, packaging, and quality-checks which are followed at the plant for their range of PU footwear.

Students were also briefed and shown about the various safety measures that the unit follows such as a ready ambulance at the facility, a medical room, and the presence of an in-house doctor. The HR policies, the accounting principles, the inventory management at the factory, and detailed quality controlmeasures were also explained to the students.

The team shared their future vision of sustainability as an important path ahead. The plant being high on electricity-usage, they said, was soon going to be enabled with solar panels to drastically reduce electricity consumption during the production process. The visit that was organized by Dr. Manju Gupta, HoD (Commerce) was enriching and invigorating for the students and the faculty accompanying them
