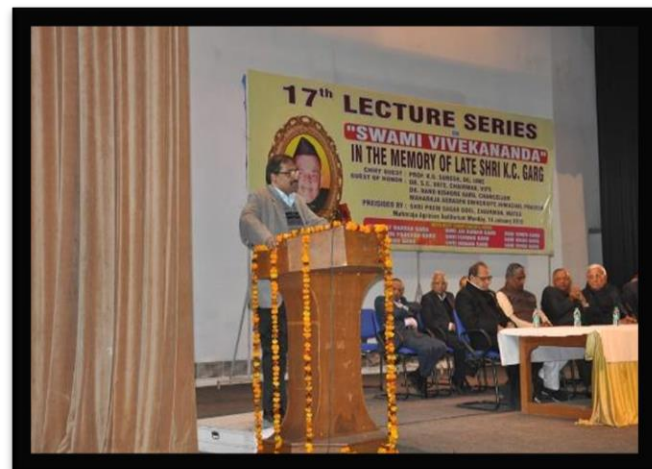

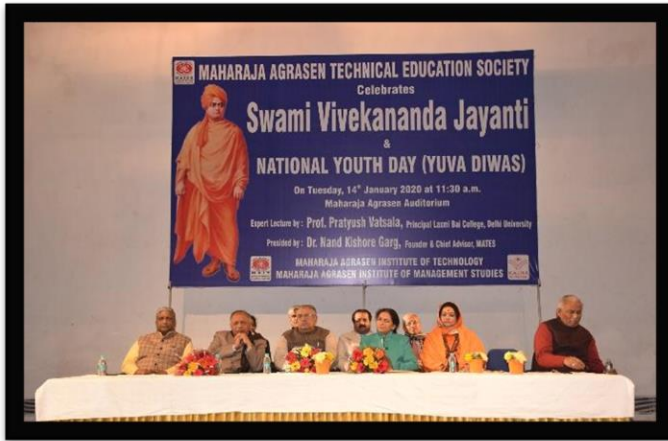
Swami Vivekananda Jayanti as National Youth Day
