




Mr. Hemant Batra

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Reports of Faculty Development Program on Research Methodology and Intellectual Property Rights

Date: Thursday, 29 July 2021 to Wednesday, 4 August 2021


A Faculty Development Program was organized by the Department of Law, Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Management Studies from 29th July 2021 to 4th August 2021. The theme of the FDP was “**Changing Aspects of Law and Teaching Pedagogy in Contemporary India**”. Its purpose was not just to facilitate upgradation of Knowledge and skills in research in law but also to help participants stay motivated and updated about the diverse teaching methods developed during the and due to the pandemic situation. A total of sixteen sessions were conducted by academicians and experts of repute in their fields. The topics covered ranged from Research methodology to Emerging Learnings in Criminal Law, IPR .

The resource person of the first session was Prof.(Dr.) Manoj Kumar Sinha who is the Director of the Indian law Institute, New Delhi and the topic was ” Outcome Based Pedagogy in Research”. Prof. Sinha has also served as the Professor of Law in West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences, Kolkata. Prof. Sinha has done his Ph.D. in International Law from Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, LL.M. from University of Nottingham, and LL.B. from University of Delhi.

Session I

The session started on the virtual platform Zoom where the esteemed speaker was welcomed by the Faculty Coordinator - Dr. Anuradha Asthana. There were over **74** participants belonging to varied backgrounds ranging from students to research scholars to academicians to lawyers etc. Prof. (Dr.) Manoj Kumar Sinha emphasized the significance of ‘Outcome’ in research Methodology. Prof. Sinha explained that it is essential to identify what is the attainable goal or in simpler terms what the researcher wishes to achieve by conducting the said research. He enlightened the participants by giving the example of the Nirbhaya Case where one of the boys who was involved in the gruesome crime was released in 2015 and various stakeholders, institutes i.e. governmental and non- governmental organizations etc. raised grave concerns that there exists a “gap” in the said law and it needs to be modified. Sir also highlighted the present scenario and the development of the vaccine i.e. the outcome that was necessary in order to curb and arrest the spread of the COVID-19 in this vaccine.

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According to Prof. Sinha 'outcome' should be applied simultaneously in research as well as in teaching i.e. to say that teaching and research are interlinked with each other and the more a teacher conducts research, the better can be their style. Prof. Sinha deliberated on various approaches of research which can be adopted to achieve the 'defined goal' and was of the firm opinion that research should not be seen in isolation. The focus of the research should be that there must be contribution in the form of outcome in the existing knowledge. The outcome must be the immediate solution to the problem. According to Prof. Sinha, the 'inquisitiveness' of the researcher can help them reach the desired goal and they should always have the quest for knowledge and should always be 'investigating'.


Prof. Sinha also discussed that Public Interest Litigation has addressed various issues that were raised by the citizens due to the gaps that exist in the society that have been thoroughly researched by the people. PIL is also known as Social Action Litigation and has served the purpose of an 'outcome' as different issues like – bonded labor, environmental concerns, conditions of prisons etc. were dealt by PIL which has led to a fruitful outcome and has introduced various changes in the legal system. Two indispensable aspects which are important to conduct research effectively are first, the Inquisitiveness and Openness of the researcher.

The second aspect includes the ability to inquire and investigate research problems efficiently to reach the outcome. Sir also emphasized that the research title should be self-explanatory and should be clear and precise. The research questions should be linked with the research problems and the research should also provide the solutions and suggestions to the proposed problem. The session was open to questions by the participants after Prof. Sinha comprehensively explained the Outcome Based Pedagogy in research and gave wider insights into the topic. Sir systematically addressed the questions raised by the participants. The session came to an end after the question-answer round.

Session II: Interdisciplinary Research

Topic of the session was "Interdisciplinary Research" and the speaker was Prof. (Dr.) Amar Pal Singh, Dean, USLLS, Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University. Prof. (Dr.) Amar Pal Singh has more than 20 years of teaching experience. He has received 8 Months Scholarship for undergoing the Course on LL.M. (Legal Theory) from European Academy of Legal Theory, Brussels, Belgium during the session 2002-2003. He is a Life Member of, Indian Law Institute, New Delhi and Indian Institute of Public Administration, New Delhi.

The session started at 3.00 P.M. on the virtual platform Zoom where the esteemed speaker was welcomed by the Faculty Coordinator -Ms. Purnim Gupta, Faculty, Department of Law. There





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
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were over 74 participants belonging to varied backgrounds ranging from students to research scholars to academicians to lawyers etc. Prof. Singh explained that 'research' cannot be learnt and has to be understood, i.e. to say that it is a set of skills and has to be cultivated by carefully conducting it. He highlighted the New Education Policy (NEP) which marks the one-year anniversary on 29th July 2021 and discussed various aspects of the said policy. Sir also explained the wide variety of challenges that NEP faces to uplift the society and help the nation to grow and sustain into a large and vibrant economy. These challenges require top notch scientific research and deep understanding of humanities and social sciences. Art, culture, history, and linguistic traditions require a high level of research and innovation. The National Education Policy also lays down that the Higher Education Institution (HEI) cannot survive today without quality research.

Prof. Singh briefly explained the reforms that the NEP focuses on and aims to achieve in the upcoming years with the help of its guiding principles which focuses on holistic learning and multidisciplinary research. These reforms include multiple entries and exit in UG/PG programs, multidisciplinary education which includes the flexibility of subjects in the undergraduate and postgraduate programs, installation of MERU i.e. Model Multidisciplinary Research University in or near every district in order to promote Interdisciplinary education and comprehensive learning. The National Education Policy aims to cultivate the research culture by providing a comprehensive approach towards education. The National Research Foundation lays down various functions like providing funds to peer reviewed grant proposals, seed, grow and facilitate research in HEIs etc.

Sir deliberated upon the impact that the lack of research in the legal discipline in general and interdisciplinary research leads to and therefore policies and legislations on various issues do not lead to the desired outcome. The implementation of these policies also fails due to the wide gap in legal and social narratives. Sir explained this by giving the example of Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961 and Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006 but these issues continue to exist in the society due to the gap in social and legal dimensions. This also occurs due to the lack of research in the policy area where the researcher seeks to create a law. Prof. Singh succinctly gave examples of various laws which are existing in our societies but are not relevant to the present times as they are not familiar with the ground realities i.e. to say Mining Sector where there exists laws that were made in 1950s but the model that is being followed is nowhere close to the 21st century where the economic development and benefit can be extracted out. The other areas that Sir briefly explained included –Energy Sector, Banking sector, Labor Market and

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Labor Laws, Linguistics and Semiotics etc. However, the ground situation remains to be hazy and there is not much research that is being conducted. Prof. Singh laid emphasis that despite new codes that are introduced in the Labor Sector, the old laws will still remain in existence. In terms of Linguistics and Semiotics, Sir explained that even after India's diverse culture and ethnicity where there are 22 official languages and almost 2000 dialects, no research as such has been conducted in order to grow this area exponentially which will lead to enormous possibilities of legal realities.

Prof. Singh made some concluding observations where he critically analyzed that the Law school teachers have developed a vested interest for outdated laws. He also emphasized that even though Law schools have the potential for extensive research, it has remained unexplored, and the legal research has not been properly 'articulated' or 'nourished' in law schools. The session was open for the query of participants that were addressed by Prof. Singh in a very precise manner. The session came to an end after the question- answer round.


Session III: Empirical Research in IPR

The resource person in the sixth session was Prof. Irene Calboli who was the expert resource person of the session. She is Professor of Law at Texas A&M University School of Law, Academic Fellow at the School of Law, University of Geneva, Fellow at Melbourne Law School, and Transatlantic Technology Law Fellow at Stanford University. Her research focuses on IP, International Trade, and Cultural Heritage Law.

The session commenced with an opening remark by Dr. Nisha Dhanraj Dewani, Associate Professor, Department of Law, MAIMS, wherein she extended her warm welcome to the participants and resource person of the session.

Prof. Irene in her lecture provided an overview of empirical studies in different areas of IP. She told the participants about how to approach and use data in their own research and scholarly work. The session was an effort to enrich research scholars and faculties in Intellectual property related areas on research methodology. In the end, Dr. Nisha Dhanraj Dewani, Associate Professor, Department of Law, presented the vote of thanks to Prof. Irene Calboli expressing her gratitude.


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Session VI : Copyright and Plagiarism Issues in Educational Sector

The topic of the Faculty Development Program was “**Copyright and Plagiarism Issues in Educational Sector**”. The resource person Dr. Alka Chawla was the expert resource person of the session. Dr. Alka Chawla is a Ph.D. in Copyright Law from the University of Delhi. She teaches Intellectual property rights, Administrative Law, and Jurisprudence. She is nominated as a “National expert on Intellectual Property” by the European Trade and Business Council, Mentor to the Intellectual Property Protection Organisation and Advisor to National IP Organisation and Member Education Committee, FICCI. The session commenced with an opening remark by Dr. Nisha Dhanraj Dewani, Associate Professor, Department of Law, MAIMS, wherein she extended her warm welcome to the participants and resource person of the Session. Dr. Chawla gave a detailed presentation on **Copyright and Plagiarism Issues in the Educational Sector**. She talked about the process of imparting education, where it starts and where it ends. Ma’am also briefed about the University Grants Commission (Promotion of Academic Integrity and Prevention of Plagiarism in Higher Education Institution) Regulations, 2018. Later, Dr. Chawla responded to the Questions and doubts raised by the participants. In the end, Dr. Nisha proposed a vote of thanks. She expressed special gratitude to Ma’am for her informative and useful presentation.


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
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

Ms. Shweta Rastogi, Assistant Professor, MAIMS, presented the vote of thanks. “Experience matters the most” with this she concluded her speech.


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


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REPORT

Research Congress

Tuesday, May 25, 2021

The session started with the welcome address by the convener, Dr. Parul Kumar, Senior Assistant Professor, Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Management Studies. She welcomed the dignitaries and motivated the participants by some amazing quotes about life and hard work. Following this, Prof. (Dr.) Vijay Kumar Khurana, HOD – Business Administration & Coordinator, IQAC addressed the audience about the theme of the session. He introduced the participants with the achievements of the MAIMS. He also wished the participants good luck for their future endeavors in research. The inaugural address has been delivered by Prof. (Dr.) Ravi Kumar Gupta, Director, MAIMS. He welcomed the keynote speaker Prof. (Dr.) Md. Aminul Islam, Professor, Faculty of Applied & Human Sciences, Universiti Malaysia, Perlis. He also thanked the coordinators of the event for their hard work in organizing the event. Prof. (Dr.) G.P. Govil, Advisor, MATES and Prof. (Dr.) S. K. Garg, Director General, MAIMS, also appreciated the team, and addressed the need of good quality research. The Inaugural session was concluded by the address of Alumnus of BBA, Batch 2010-13, Mr. Jaffy Gill. He not only shared his broad experience about his journey of becoming a Project Manager at NIELSON, with the attendees, and motivated them with his kind words. The sessions had around 350 participants.

The theme of the first session of One Week Research Congress 2021 was “Essentials of Research”. It has been delivered by Prof. (Dr.) Md. Aminul Islam, Professor, Faculty of Applied & Human Sciences, Universiti Malaysia, Perlis. The session focused on the significance of different aspects and factors of research. According to him, Research is the ‘Telling and selling a story is research’ or ‘Finding a solution to the problem is research’. He explained the research by taking an example of a full-grown tree, calling it ‘The Tree Analogy’. He described the Inductive and Deductive theories with an example of a garden full of flowers. He also elucidated about other topics like language of research, steps of identification and definition of a research problem, organizing literature review, types of variables, theoretical framework, hypothesis, idea of sampling and data analysis and hypothesis testing. At the end, he concluded his session by comparing researchers with a kid, both are inquisitive about their respective subjects. He had covered all the points in the easiest way to make the audience understand the subject better. The session concluded

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with the query session, which were answered by speaker in the most interesting way possible. His session has brought new insights to the attendees on the subject. Finally, Ms. Rachita Aggarwal, Co-Convener of Research Congress 2021, and Assistant Professor, MAIMS gave the concluding remarks and vote of thanks. One Week Research Congress focused on the significance of LinkedIn. The session started with the welcome address by Ms. Sarita Garg, Associate Professor, MAIMS. She delivered a welcome speech for all of the students and dignitaries and gave a brief explanation on the benefits of LinkedIn. With her warm greetings, she introduced Ms. Jinal Shah, the resource person of the session. Ms. Jinal Shah, Assistant Professor, NMIMS discussed the LinkedIn usage for everyone in very lucid manner. According to her, branding is what your social media profile has to say about you.

She initially started with the topic of why personal branding is important and how we leverage LinkedIn for our benefit. She counseled participants about the importance of LinkedIn and how LinkedIn helps one to improve his/her profile. She said that LinkedIn helps in networking and 85% of jobs are available because of networking. She also gave some tips on how to make a LinkedIn profile and how to use it.

She also delivered a brief idea of the target audience on LinkedIn. Subsequently, she made us do an experiment in which we had to type our name on google and share the results. With this experiment, she said that "Your brand is not what you say about it, it's what Google says it is." Further, she focused on the LinkedIn profile by suggesting being authentic. She also focused on the point of what we should post and share on LinkedIn. She further extended her topic by discussing the types of visual content to boost visual content marketing. She gave some tips to share content on LinkedIn that we should post in a week minimum of two times and a maximum of five times and always use hashtags not more than five hashtags. Also, it is important to be regular and engage consistently by liking and sharing the content. Then the participants got the privilege to see a live demo session on how to manage LinkedIn profiles. In a live session, she discussed how to post anything and then she discussed some posted content and told us how the content should be qualitative and not quantitative.

Later, Ms. Jinal gave a summary of how anyone can find or apply for jobs and opportunities on LinkedIn in just a few steps. She covered all the points in the easiest way to manage the profile and how to engage and how we can bring professionalism in our LinkedIn profiles. After the session, the participants asked questions in the Q&A session. Her session was truly informative for all the attendees and has brought some new insights & self-branding techniques using LinkedIn. After her session, Dr.

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Ravi Kumar Gupta, Director, MAIMS joined us, and motivated us with his enthusiastic message. A vote of thanks was extended by Dr. Charu Mohla, Associate Professor, MAIMS. The session was indeed amazing and left a great impact on the attendees.


One-day workshop on “Cross-Training of Library Staff”

The event was attended by 490 participants including 106 students of MAIMS. The Inaugural session of workshop on 9th August 2020 was enthusiastically attended by eminent personalities. Professor (Dr.) S. 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

In his thought provoking session sir stressed upon the following points to develop entrepreneurial structure in India:

Dr. Nand Kishore Garg, Chairman, Kautilya International Federation; Founder & Chief Advisor, Maharaja Agrasen Technical Education Society (MATES); and Chancellor, Maharaja Agrasen University, H.P motivated all the participants in his presidential address and conveyed his gratitude towards the chief guest and other dignitaries. Dr. Garg presented his views on the Kautilya's ideology and its relevance in today's scenario. Sir focussed on the importance of imparting quality education in students that will make them job creators and not job seekers. Professor (Dr) Ravi Kumar Gupta, Director, MAIMS delivered the vote of thanks and expressed his heartfelt gratitude towards all the eminent personalities and participants.

The first session of the workshop titled "Entrepreneurship in Indian thought process" stated with the insights from Indian history presented by Mr. Ajit Tiwari, Founder Director, KIF. The key speaker for the session Professor (Dr) P. Kanagasabapathi, Renowned economist, Author of the famous book, "Indian model of economy, business and management"; Member, DGCA and; Member, ICSSR mentioned India's glorious history of being self- reliant and advocated the deep rooted entrepreneurial tendency in Indians waiting to be nurtured and

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flourished. Prof. Kanagasabapathi mentioned the rich business legacy prevalent in India and the capacity and capability of Indians in making India Self Reliant even today by quoting examples of Diamond business in Surat and the four-month development and transformation of being exports of PPE kits for healthcare workers from being imports of the same four months back.

The second session of day-1 titled “Entrepreneurship Society” started with an interaction between key speaker Mr. Tulsi Tawari, Author- Global economics & ShubhLabh and D. Balasubramaniam (Financial Strategist, Active in India & Phillipines). Mr. Tulsi elaborated on the pivotal role of entrepreneurs as pioneering entrepreneurs and knowledge entrepreneurs.

Dr. Amit Kumar Dwivedi, Associate Professor, EDII, Ahmedabad initiated his address by throwing light on education system and ideology followed in the past. Dr. Dwivedi shared some facts about downfall in the India’s contribution towards world’s GDP and elaborated on the reasons for the such downfall. Day 1 of workshop ended with enlightenment and zeal in the minds of the participants.

Dr. Amit Kumar Dwivedi started his speech with a thought that this is the best time to empower and develop ourselves due to the spread of COVID-19 and implementation of lockdown almost all over the world. He told everyone that he will be discussing some research findings, historical aspects of family business and what can be done in the field of succession in a family business.

Sh. Suriyemani Singh explained the Self-Reliance concept as mentioned by Prime Minister Modi was mentioned by the speaker. Unless until individuals become self-reliant. The concept of Self-Reliance starts from the individual. Therefore, unless the mindset of entrepreneurship is installed in the individual the pathway of Self-Reliance will not be achievable. Mr. Prashant Kumar Sinha took over from here, he started by talking about innovation, which he further explained to be a very complicated attempt with uncertainties, where diverse economic and social factors are complexly related, and its outcome is impossible to predict. Prof. S.K. Bhatt gave wonderful information about the business incubators, Ms. Sakshi Gupta welcomed Prof. S.K. Bhatt. Prof. S.K. Bhatt started by thanking everyone and especially Mr. Tiwari for inviting him. He said that the entrepreneurs should know that which type of project they have to choose so he talked about the various types of project namely industrial project which includes micro and small scale units.

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medium-scale units and large units, service-oriented projects, tourism-related projects, and so on.

The next speaker was Mr. Neeraj Kumar who explained that the government's initiative of self-reliant India is not beneficial just for the citizens but is very important for the economy of the country as a whole. "The entrepreneur's main problem is finances," said the speaker. Ms. Sakshi Gupta, the host of the day, thanked our last speaker of the session saying "Being an entrepreneur, male or female, in any part of the world is always a challenge.

On third day, the first speaker was Mr. Tulsi Tiwari. He discussed about the notion and concept of money and how it is affecting our lives in a very big way. Then shortage of capital into the country and how it gives rise to foreign direct investment.

The next speaker, Mr. Bala then started presenting his ideas. He said that we have technology which is innovative and we use it to create monopolies. We need to start spending more on advertising because we're trying to use technology to cut down other required overheads like mechanization. At the same time, we do automation saying that it controls cost but then we increase expenditure on marketing by capturing the market.

Mr. Raja rejoined the conversation and continued by taking a point raised by the previous speaker. He talked about the technology landscape over the last few years, where it hasn't shown much change except among the technocrats and people who use it on large scale. The perception has been that technology aids the concentration of economic power and said technology is capital intensive and costly and therefore is in the hands of the owners of capital. And if this leads to concentration of economic power, then it will also lead to all the ills mentioned earlier by Mr. Tulsi namely manipulation, speculation, parasitic destruction, wealth destruction and what we see today is a sort of cannibalistic culture. Ms. Sakshi Gupta invited Ms. Usha Nair to give the concluding remarks on final session of Day 2 of three-day workshop. She expressed her big thanks to all respected speakers.

The third day of the Workshop on "Entrepreneurship as a Pathway to Make India Self-Reliant" equally enlightening and offered a highly learning and interactive experience to the participants.

The day started with an introductory session by Dr. Rudresh Pandey, National Co Convener, KIF & professor, ABES, Ghaziabad. Dr. Pandey emphasized on the role of Indian traditional knowledge in developing Entrepreneurial skill in Indians. Dr. Pandey elaborated the embedded

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psychology of Cycle of Creation, Cycle of Preservation, Cycle of Destruction represented by Brahma, Vishnu and Shiva respectively.


