On 8th November 2024, three nukkad nataks (street plays) were performed at Sarvodaya Kanya Vidyalaya and Rajkoya Pratibha Vikas Vidyalaya, in collaboration with the Praha Foundation. The plays aimed to raise awareness about important social issues and inform students about their legal rights. The first play focused on domestic violence, showing the different forms of abuse that occur in homes. The message was clear: domestic violence is wrong, and people should know their rights and seek help if they are abused. It encouraged victims to report abuse and reach out for support. The second play was about a patriarchal society, highlighting gender inequality and how women are often treated unfairly. It challenged traditional ideas about gender roles and encouraged students to advocate for equality. It also explained the laws that protect women's rights. The third play addressed child abuse, showing how children can suffer from neglect, violence, and exploitation. The message was to protect children and ensure they grow up in safe environments. It also taught students how to recognize abuse and the legal actions in place to protect children. Each performance was followed by a legal awareness session, where students were informed about their rights, the laws protecting them,

and how to seek help if needed. The event aimed not only to educate students about important legal issues but also to empower them to recognize injustice and take action when necessary. The nukkad nataks successfully engaged the students, providing them with an understanding of these pressing social issues and the legal frameworks designed to address them. Through these performances, the students learned the importance of standing up for justice, supporting victims, and playing an active role in creating a more equitable and just society
