## Educational cum Environment Field Visit to Amrit Udyan, New Delhi

As part of the Environmental Studies (EVS) curriculum, a field visit to Amrit Udyan, New Delhi was organized on 21st February 2025 for BCA 1st Year students. The primary objective of this visit was to provide students with practical exposure to environmental conservation, biodiversity, and sustainable landscaping practices. The visit allowed students to explore the role of green spaces in urban environments and understand the importance of plant diversity and sustainability. The visit commenced at 9:00 AM, with all 60 students and faculty members departing from the institute. Upon arrival at Amrit Udyan, students were taken on a guided tour, where they observed a variety of indigenous and exotic plant species, including medicinal plants and seasonal flowers. They learned about sustainable gardening techniques such as rainwater harvesting, organic composting, and eco-friendly pest control methods.
