The Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Management Studies organised a blood donation camp on 23rd January 2025. The event, held in collaboration with **Rotary Blood Centre, Red Cross Society, Ram Manohar Lohia Hospital and Shri Agrasen International Hospital** was a remarkable success, showcasing the enthusiasm and sense of social responsibility among the students, faculty, and staff.

The camp emphasized the importance of blood donation in saving lives and building a compassionate society. The event commenced at 09:30 a.m. and continued until 05:30 p.m., with over 216 participants volunteering to donate blood.

Prior to the event, NSS volunteers conducted awareness campaigns across the campus, highlighting the benefits and process of blood donation. Informative posters and pamphlets were distributed, and

motivational talks were held to encourage maximum participation.

A team of trained medical professionals from all the four Blood Bank Societies ensured that the donation process was safe and hygienic. Donors underwent a preliminary health check-up to confirm their eligibility. Refreshments were provided to all donors post-donation to help them recover.

In total, 129 units of blood were collected, which will be utilized to aid patients in need of emergency medical care. The NSS unit also honored the donors with certificates of appreciation for their noble act with various gift hampers to the Donors.

The camp also focused on spreading awareness about the numerous benefits of donating blood, such as:

The event not only provided much-needed blood to the local blood bank but also inspired many students to contribute to society through such meaningful acts. The NSS unit plans to continue organizing similar events in the future to promote the spirit of service and social responsibility.
