On 25th October 2024, a visit to the Indian Parliament was organized for BBA students, offering a unique opportunity to gain insights the Indian legislative process and the democratic setup. The visit aimed to provide students with firsthand exposure to the functioning of one of the world's largest democracies and foster a deeper understanding of political and governmental structures.

Students were instructed to reach **Central Secretariat Metro Station**, **Gate No. 1** by 9:45 AM. Faculty members and coordinators ensured that all participants arrived on time, and a brief orientation was conducted. This session included an overview of the day's itinerary, instructions on behavior and protocol within the Parliament premises.

After assembling at the designated meeting point, students proceeded to the Parliament premises. A thorough security check was conducted as part of standard protocol, ensuring compliance with the Parliament's guidelines. The group was then escorted to the visitors' gallery by the coordinators.
