Report on Parliament Visit: Democratic and Legal Awareness

1st year students (BBA-LLB, Batch 2022-2027) of Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Management Studies, Department of Law embarked on an educational visit to the Parliament of India, New Delhi along with Professor Dr Praveen Gupta (HOD, Law), Dr. Deepa Kaushik (Associate Professor) and Ms. Disha Moitra (Assistant Professor) accompanying the students. A total of 50 BBALLB students visited the temple of Democracy on 25th April 2025. The purpose of the visit was to provide students with firsthand exposure to the functioning of the Indian Parliamentary system and foster a practical understanding of the democratic governance structure.

The visit commenced with great zeal and with an insightful session about the workings of Parliament at the Central Hall of the old Parliament building, highlighting the significance of the Central Hall during the Independence of our country and the Drafting of Our Constitution. After the session, students and faculty

members visited the New Parliament building to understand the significance of the infrastructure of the new Parliament, wherein the Lok Sabha is built on the Mayur (Peacock) Theme and the Rajya Sabha is built on the Kamal (Lotus) Theme. Visit provided an opportunity to understand the significance of different gates– Makar Dwar, Garud Dwar, Hans Dwar, Gaj Dwar, Ashwa Dwar and Shardul Dwar– of the New Parliament building. Thereafter, students proceeded on a well-guided tour to explore the Lok Sabha Hall and Rajya Sabha Hall, along with the opportunity to sit in the public gallery of both houses of the Parliament House. The pertinent tour efficiently explained the intricacies of different halls and elaborated upon various insightful facts about the structures, parliamentary proceedings and other arrangements. The group further proceeded for the group photographs at various prestigious spots in the Parliament premises.

Thereafter the group got an opportunity to visit the Parliament's Art Museum, exploring a magnificent collection of artworks portraying India's democratic journey. The gallery featured thematic paintings depicting historic events such as the adoption of the Constitution and the freedom movement. In the adjoining Gallery, eight remarkable installations Gyan (knowledge), Prakriti (nature), Aastha (faith), Ullas (joyfulness), Parv (festival), Samrasta (harmony), Swavlamban (self-reliance), and Yatra (journey) were showcased, each handcrafted using traditional craft techniques that reflected the country's diverse culture and heritage.

Lastly, the students were served lunch in the canteen of the New Parliamentary building and they expressed their gratitude to the Head of the Department and the faculty members for organizing such a wonderful and knowledgeable visit which not only helped the students gain knowledge but also allowed them to witness the fascinating Parliament of India.
