One Day Seminar "Development of Constitutional Law in India and Investment Law in Uzbekistan"

On 07th August 2025, the Department of Law, MAIMS successfully organised a one day seminar on "Development of Constitutional Law in India and Investment Law in Uzbekistan". The purpose of the seminar was to enlighten our students, specially of the third year BALLB and BBALLB about various aspects of the Constitutional Law in India and the Investment Laws of the Central Asian country of Uzbekistan.

This seminar was organised in collaboration with the Indian Council of Cultural Relations, Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India.

The program started with the felicitation of the guests by Prof.(Dr.) Rajni Malhotra Dhingra, Director MAIMS; Prof.(Dr.) Praveen Kumar Gupta , Head, Department of Law MAIMS and Dr. Nisha Dhanraj Dewani, Associate Professor, Department of Law, MAIMS. It was followed by the introductory remarks by Prof.(Dr.) Praveen Kumar Gupta.

The resource person Prof.(Dr.) Amanullah Z. Mukhamed, Professor of International Law and Human Rights, at Uzbekistan State Law University, Tashkent, highlighted the main features of the Constitution of Uzbekistan which is quite progressive and which offers equality to women. One third of the members of the Uzbek Parliament are women. Another important provision which he shared was that in the Uzbek constitution, there is a provision that it is the responsibility of the government to provide housing to each and every citizen.

He also highlighted upon the immense economic opportunity which Uzbekistan has to offer like various commercial agricultural products and petroleum products. He also apprised the gathering about the upcoming train connectivity between Uzbekistan, Afganistan and India. Prof. Amanullah also stressed upon the possibility of exchange programs between the two countries in the field of education in the near future. He highlighted the Indo-Uzbekistan trade corridor which has seen a remarkable expansion particularly in pharmaceuticals, agro-products, and education. Prof. Amanullah provided deep insight into current developments in India and their broader global relevance.

Prof. Amanullah also presented a translated copy of the Indian Constitution to our Director Prof. (Dr.) Rajni Malhotra Dhingra. It has been translated in Uzbek language by him. This is the first ever translation of the Constitution of India in any foreign language.

The session ended with a lively Question Answer round where student asked their questions on a number of issues relating to the various provisions of the Constitution of Uzbekistan and the economic cooperation between the two countries.

Prof. Amanullah was accompanied by his daughter Dr. Madina who did the role of an interpreter very effortlessly and effectively.

Another speaker of the day was Ms. Manika Gandhi, Assistant Professor, Department of Law, MAIMS. She spoke on the topic “Corporate & Compliances in India with special reference to Investment Laws”.

The seminar ended with the “Vote of Thanks” presented by Dr. Anuradha Asthana Singh.
