A short trip was organized for the students of first year BALLB to the Delhi Vidhan Sabha premises. This exhibition was organised to commemorate the hundred years of the elected speaker of the Central Legislative Assembly. Sir Vithal Bhai Patel was elected as the first speaker of the Legislative Assembly on 24<sup>th</sup> August 1925. This was not only a political achievement, but a historic step towards self- respect

The exhibition themed "*Veer Vithal Bhai Patel Gaurav Gatha*" (The glory of Veer Vithalbhai Patel) focussed not just on Patel's election but also on the wider freedom struggle. A lot of archival material and information was displayed, which included the communication between Vithal Bhai Patel and Mahatma Gandhi. The original death certificate of Shahid Bhagat Singh was also displayed. A very interesting document displayed, showed that Sri Vithalbhai Patel had willed to donate his entire property to Subhash Chandra Bose so that he (Subhash Bose ) could carry on the struggle to liberate India from the British rule.

A photo displayed in the exhibition showed how Vithal Bhai Patel refused to leave his chair for Lord Irwin, the Viceroy of India, and so one more chair was put and after that it became a precedent in the British empire forever.

The students greatly benefitted from the visit and came to know about some of the unknown facts of India's freedom struggle.

Students were accompanied by the mentors Dr. Anuradha Asthana Singh, Ms. Manika Gandhi, Dr. Mallika Tosha and Mr. Eshan Bhardwaj.
