On 27th August 2025, Interdisciplinary Faculty Lecture committee of MAIMS organized a lecturer on "Parliament of India and Parliamentary Practices and Procedures" by Dr. V.K. Bhatnagar, Advisor, Deptt. Of Law and J&MC the Lecture was organised as an interactive activity of the series, which has been packaged as the Internal Faculty Knowledge exchange Program. The lecture elaborated on how parliament of India and parliamentary practices and procedures are works

Dr. Bhatnagar began by explaining the bicameral structure of the Indian Parliament, comprising the President, Lok Sabha, and Rajya Sabha. He highlighted the composition, tenure, and powers of both Houses, drawing attention to the roles of the Speaker of Lok Sabha and the Chairman of Rajya Sabha in maintaining order and discipline during proceedings.

The session further explored parliamentary practices and procedures, including the importance of Question Hour, Zero Hour, and various motions and debates as instruments to ensure government accountability. The process of law-making, involving the introduction, discussion, and passing of bills—ordinary, money, and constitutional amendment bills—was discussed in detail.

In addition, Dr. Bhatnagar elaborated on the key functions of Parliament:

- **Legislative Function:** Framing and amending laws.
- **Financial Function:** Passing the budget and controlling public expenditure.
- **Executive Accountability:** Questioning ministers and using tools like motions and debates.
- **Deliberative Function:** Discussing national and international issues.
- **Constitutional Role:** Amending the Constitution and electing constitutional authorities.

The lecture also emphasized the Parliament's role as the cornerstone of Indian democracy, ensuring transparency, accountability, and representation of the people's voice in governance. The session was insightful, interactive, and thought-provoking. The program concluded with a formal vote of thanks to Dr. V. K. Bhatnagar for his enlightening address.
