OUTREACH PROGRAM – “BE THE SPARK FOR A GREENER TOMORROW”

The Department of Commerce, MAIMS, in collaboration with NSS, as part of the community outreach initiative, five students from **B. Com (Hons)** visited an **MCD School** on **17th October, 2025 (Friday)** to conduct an awareness session on the theme “**Green Diwali – Be the Spark for a Greener Tomorrow**”.
