REPORT

The MAIMS Moot Court Society, under the Department of Law, MAIMS, organised the 7th Intra Moot Court Competition, 2026, which comprised preliminary and final rounds. The Moot Proposition was based on Medical Negligence and Consumer Protection Law, concerning a dispute involving alleged negligence in surgical and post-operative care of a newborn infant resulting in permanent bodily paralysis. The key issues included interpretation of medical negligence in view of its applicability as a ‘service’ under the Consumer Protection Act, 2019, informed consent and contributory negligence.

To prepare and train the students for the moot court, two sessions were conducted. The first session was conducted by Mr. Abhjeet Raj (Advisor to the MAIMS Moot Court Society) on 17th February, 2026. Building on this foundation, Mr Joy Puri, a fourth-year law student, conducted a session on Enhancing Oratory Skills on 19th March, 2026.

The moot proposition was released on 10th February, 2026 and the detailed rulebook was released on 18th February, 2026. The process advanced with the Researcher’s Test being conducted on 30th

March, 2026 at 2:00 P.M. in offline mode (pen and paper format), followed by the Memorial Exchange and the release of Official Power Fixtures.

The Preliminary Round was conducted on 1st April, 2026 from 1:30 P.M. onwards in two slots, with 288 students forming 96 teams. Each round was judged by a panel of two judges comprising esteemed legal professionals, academicians, and faculty members, ensuring a balanced assessment, followed by constructive feedback for participants.

The Final Round was held on 2nd April, 2026, featuring the top two teams, TC-03 and TC-06. The proceedings began with the draw of lots, followed by a memorial exchange. The round was adjudicated by a panel of three judges, Advocate Shubham Kumar Anand, Dr. Deepa Kaushik, and Advocate Anuj Mishra, who provided insightful feedback, appreciating the participants performance while encouraging improvement in courtroom etiquette, time management, and responsiveness to questions.

The MAIMS 7th Intra Moot Court Competition, 2026 concluded with remarkable performances from all participating teams. TC-06, comprising Ananya Sharma, Shaifali, and Sunakshi Sharma, emerged as the winning team, while TC-03, represented by Mannat Vijayran, Palak Chitkara, and Aryan Debnath, secured the Runner-Up position.
