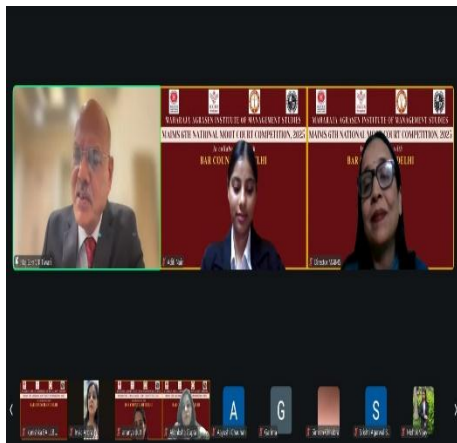
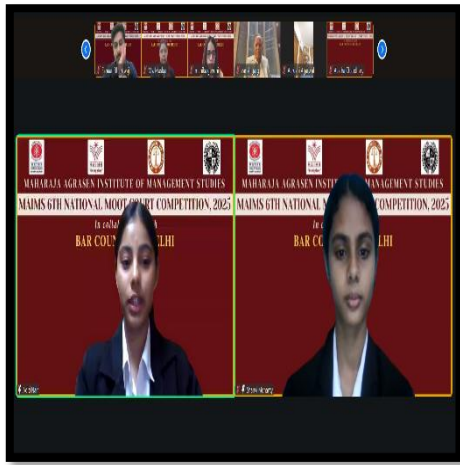

INAUGURAL CEREMONY (6th November, 2025)

The Moot Court Society of the Department of Law, Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Management Studies (MAIMS), Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi, hosted the Inaugural Ceremony of the MAIMS 6th National Moot Court Competition, 2025 in collaboration with Bar Council of Delhi, on 6th November, 2025 in online mode via Zoom. The inaugural session was presided over by the Chief Guest, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Anup Jairam Bhambani, Judge, Delhi High Court, along with Major General Vinod Kumar Tiwari (Retd.), Ministry of Defence, Government of India.

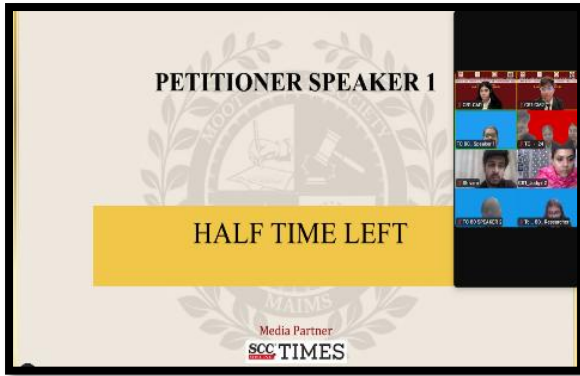
The inaugural session commenced with a Saraswati Vandana, followed by the MAIMS Kulgeet, setting an auspicious and unifying tone. This was followed by introductory remarks by Ms. Sakshi Madan (Assistant Professor) and Ms. Kashni (Assistant Professor), who briefed the participants on the theme of the moot proposition, which primarily involved constitutional freedoms, national security, and digital rights arising from the Pahalgam Attack and Operation Sindoor, and outlined the awards, structure, and format of the competition.

Prof. (Dr.) Rajni Malhotra Dhingra, Director, MAIMS appreciated the participation of 64 teams nationwide and acknowledged the efforts of the Organizing Committee. Major General Tiwari addressed the gathering on democratic pillars, litigation skills and national defence, urging students to persevere, while Hon'ble Justice Bhambani underscored the importance of moot courts in fostering research, discipline and advocacy. The ceremony concluded with a vote of thanks by Prof. (Dr.) Praveen Kumar Gupta, followed by the National Anthem, officially marking the commencement of the prestigious competition.



PRELIMINARY ROUNDS (7th November, 2025)

On 7th November, 2025, the MAIMS 6th National Moot Court Competition, 2025, witnessed a compelling battle of legal acumen as 62 teams from all over the nation, competed in Preliminary Round I and II. The day commenced with Researcher's Test at 09:00 AM, and

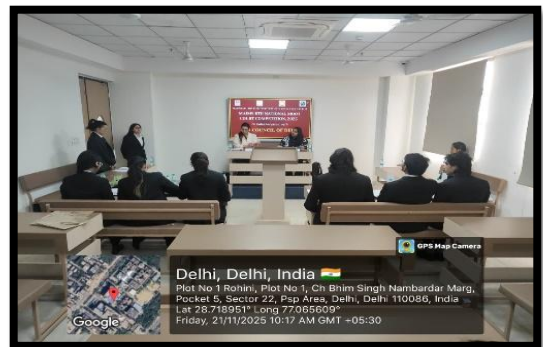


followed by the online rounds from 11:00 AM, via Zoom, where participants presented their legal arguments. A distinguished panel of 62 judges, comprising eminent attorneys and academicians, presided over the proceedings, ensuring a fair and insightful evaluation. The judges provided constructive feedback on argument presentation,

enriching the participants' understanding of advocacy and guiding them to refine their skills for future rounds. Following a day of rigorous advocacy and spirited participation, the results were announced by Ms. Disha Moitra and Ms. Isha Kaushal, Assistant Professors, Department of Law, with 8 teams emerging victorious and qualifying for the highly anticipated Offline Oral Rounds on the basis of the highest aggregate score for both Preliminary Rounds.

QUARTER FINAL ROUND (21st November, 2025)

The Quarter-Final Round of the MAIMS 6th National Moot Court Competition, 2025, in collaboration with the Bar Council of Delhi held on 21st November, 2025, featured an intense and highly competitive legal contest among the top 8 qualifying teams. The teams showcased outstanding preparation, delivering structured oral submissions backed by thorough legal research and strong analytical reasoning. The round was conducted before a distinguished panel of 8 judges, consisting of experienced legal professionals and academicians,



who rigorously assessed the participants on their legal knowledge, advocacy skills, and ability to respond to complex judicial questions. The courtroom atmosphere was charged with intellectual rigor and competitive spirit, as each team demonstrated confidence, clarity of thought, and professionalism throughout their arguments. Following a closely contested session, 4 teams advanced to the Semi-Final Round, marking a crucial milestone in the progression of the competition.

SEMI-FINAL ROUND (21st November, 2025)

Followed by the Quarter- Final Round, the Semi-Final Rounds of the MAIMS 6th National Moot Court Competition, 2025, in collaboration with the Bar Council of Delhi, held on the same day showcased an exceptional standard of advocacy and legal intellect. The top 4 teams:



TC-07, TC-09, TC-28, and TC-54, competed in a highly charged courtroom setting, delivering thoroughly researched submissions and demonstrating remarkable analytical and advocacy skills. The proceedings were conducted before a distinguished bench of 6 eminent judges, comprising leading legal practitioners and academicians, who subjected

the teams to rigorous questioning and critical evaluation. Marked by incisive arguments, compelling rebuttals, and exemplary courtroom decorum, the Semi-Final Rounds emerged as one of the most intellectually engaging phases of the competition. Following an intensely contested session, 2 teams secured their positions in the Final Round, setting the stage for a grand and gripping conclusion to the competition.

FINAL ROUND (22nd November, 2025)

On 22nd November, 2025, the Grand Finale of the MAIMS 6th National Moot Court Competition, 2025, in collaboration with the Bar Council of Delhi, witnessed a compelling legal contest between the top 2 finalist teams. The proceedings were presided over by Hon'ble Ms. Justice Neena Bansal Krishna, Judge, Delhi High Court and Hon'ble Mr. Justice Girish Kathpalia, Judge, Delhi High Court. The finalists demonstrated exemplary advocacy skills, incisive legal reasoning, and commendable courtroom decorum throughout the session. The finale culminated in the Valedictory Ceremony, wherein the winners were felicitated for their outstanding performance and remarkable achievements.



VALEDICTORY CEREMONY (22nd November, 2025)

On 22nd November, 2025, following the Final Round of the MAIMS 6th National Moot Court Competition, 2025, in collaboration with the Bar Council of Delhi, the Valedictory Ceremony was held in the esteemed presence of Hon'ble Justice Navin Sinha, Former Judge, Supreme Court of India, Hon'ble Justice Neena Bansal Krishna, Judge, Delhi High Court and Hon'ble Justice Girish Kathpalia, Judge, Delhi High Court. The final round witnessed an intense battle between the top 2 teams, adjudicated by a distinguished panel of 2 judges. After a rigorous and intellectually stimulating session, the results were announced by Dr. Nisha Dhanraj Dewani, Faculty Convenor, MAIMS Moot Court Society, along with Ms. Meenakshi Gupta and Ms. Disha Moitra, Members, MAIMS Moot Court Society, with Team TC-07 from the Army Institute of Law, Mohali emerging as Winner, while Team TC-54 from Vivekananda Institute of Professional Studies- Technical Campus (VIPS- TC) secured the Runner-up position. The award for Best Memorial was presented to Team TC-36 from the Central University of South Bihar, while Abhinav Prakash Arya from Team TC-17 CPJ Institute of Management & Technology (CPJIMT) was adjudged Best Speaker, and the Best Researcher title was awarded to Team TC-42 of KIIT School of Law. The ceremony concluded with words of appreciation from the dignitaries, celebrating the spirit of legal excellence.
