Insightful Session on Fashion Law

The Internship and Placement Committee of Department of Law, Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Management Studies, organized an insightful session on Fashion Law on 7th March 2026. The session was conducted in virtual mode and was attended by around 55 students from different semesters. The session was conducted by Ms. Shaina Khurana, who shared her knowledge and experience about building a career in the field of fashion law. She explained that fashion law is not a separate law with its own statute but rather a combination of different areas of law such as intellectual property law, corporate law, contract law and labour law. She also discussed how issues like brand protection, design protection and licensing are handled in the fashion industry.

During the session, the speaker also talked about the impact of artificial intelligence (AI) on the fashion industry and how it is slowly affecting the legal aspects of design creation and ownership. She further highlighted that labour conditions in the fashion industry are not always well regulated and in many cases professionals like models have to rely mainly on their contacts and personal negotiation to ensure fair treatment. While discussing internships, she advised students that they should start exploring fashion law after their third year of law school, as the initial years should be used to explore different fields of law before choosing a specialization. She also clarified that although fashion law may appear glamorous from outside, in reality it functions like any other corporate legal practice.

Ms. Khurana also suggested that students who are interested in this field should build a strong foundation in corporate law along with intellectual property law. She mentioned that additional qualifications such as Company Secretary (CS) can also be helpful because many international brands prefer professionals who understand both legal and corporate compliance aspects. She further suggested that students can pursue diploma courses in areas such as intellectual property law, technology law or AI law, preferably from reputed institutions like National Law Universities. She also encouraged students to read important IPR judgments, especially those delivered by the Delhi High Court, and to actively publish research papers and articles during law school.

The session was highly informative and provided valuable guidance to students who are interested in exploring emerging fields like fashion law and understanding how legal principles operate within the fashion industry.
