Legal Awareness Drive in Pansali Village

On 28th August 2025, the **MAIMS Legal Services Clinic**, in collaboration with the **MAIMS Pro Bono club**, conducted a Legal Awareness Drive in the **adopted village of Pansali, Rohini**. The primary objective of the initiative was to aware about importance of cleanliness, the availability of Pro Bono legal services, the Nyaya Bandhu App, governmental initiatives, and the fundamental rights and duties of citizens. The drive commenced at 1:30 PM in the presence of

Dr. Purnima Gupta (Faculty Convenor, Legal Services Clinic) **Dr. Nisha Dhanraj Dewani** (Faculty Convenor, Pro Bono Club) and the Village Pradhan of Pansali, Sh. Ved Veer Rathore. The members of the Legal Services Clinic first visited the Pansali Shiv Mandir, where they were welcomed by the Pradhan and the temple priest. Thereafter, the students undertook a door-to-door campaign, engaging with villagers, particularly women and children, to create awareness regarding their rights and duties in maintaining a clean environment. The team also introduced the Nyaya Bandhu App, emphasizing the provision of free legal services.



The event was formally Inaugurated with an introductory address about the Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Management Studies (MAIMS), followed by a detailed explanation of the role of the Pro Bono Club and the Legal Services Clinic in facilitating access to justice for economically disadvantaged sections of society.

A Nukkad Natak was performed by the students, highlighting the issues of mismanagement and lack of awareness concerning environmental cleanliness. The performance showed a situation in which villagers gradually adopted

practices that ensured a clean and healthy environment. The Nukkad Natak effectively emphasized the significance of awareness, individual discipline, and the utilization of government schemes aimed at promoting sanitation.

Following the Nukkad Natak, an interactive discussion was conducted to aware the villagers of several government schemes, policies, and statutes, including the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan (2014), the Environment Protection Act (1986), the Solid Waste Management Rules (2016), and others. They were also informed about the Swachh Delhi App and the recently launched Swachh Delhi Sankalp Abhiyan (2025). The villagers were encouraged to adopt environmentally conscious practices and to actively participate in such initiatives.



Additionally, refreshments were provided, and both the Faculty Convenor, Dr. Purnima Gupta and Dr. Nisha Dhanraj Dewani and the village Sarpanch addressed the gathering, engaging in meaningful dialogue with the villagers.

During the course of the drive, certain issues were encountered. A section of the villagers emphasized towards their personal grievances and attributing lapses in cleanliness to their neighbours, rather than recognising their own duty and civic obligations.

To conclude, the objective of the drive assistance was provided to villagers in registering on the Nyaya Bandhu App. The Legal Awareness Drive served as a significant initiative towards promoting legal literacy and social responsibility.
