Legal Services Clinic (विधि मित्र), Department of Law, MAIMS actively participated in a multi-day legal awareness campaign aimed at promoting legal literacy among the general public through the medium of street theatre. This initiative effectively combined the traditional art form of nukkad natak with legal advocacy to disseminate awareness regarding fundamental rights and the availability of free legal aid services provided by the Delhi State Legal Services Authority. The campaign commenced at the Rouse Avenue District Court, where the performance served both as a formal evaluation and a community outreach effort. After completing security formalities, the team assembled in the performance hall to rehearse and refine the script. The act was presented before Tanvi Khurana and Abhinav Pandey, who presided over the evaluation. The performance was well-received, and constructive feedback was provided, particularly by Abhinav Pandey, who appreciated

the effort and offered valuable suggestions to enhance the impact of the act for larger audiences. Following the performance and refreshments, transportation was arranged by the DSLSA for the team to proceed to the next venue at the International Trade Fair held at Pragati Maidan.

International Trade Fair (Pragati Maidan) – Day 1 & 2:

The second phase of the campaign was conducted at the International Trade Fair, where the team was stationed at the DSLSA Stall (Hall No. 1, Stall No. 1F02). The Faculty Coordinator Ms. Heena Mongia visited the fair along with students. On the first day, the focus was on spreading awareness through performance, as the team presented the street play on the main cultural stage before a large and diverse audience. The play effectively highlighted several critical legal issues, including maintenance rights under Section 125 CrPC and Section 144 BNSS, protection of children under the POCSO Act, consumer rights and remedies, and the role of DSLSA in providing free legal aid and legal representation. On the second day, the emphasis shifted towards direct public engagement and interaction. After performing again on the cultural stage, the team engaged with members of the public who approached them with legal queries. Individuals were guided on accessing legal assistance through the toll-free helpline (1516), and several were directed to the DSLSA stall where professional counsellors were available to provide immediate consultation and address their grievances effectively.

The campaign proved to be highly impactful, as performing before a large audience at the International Trade Fair enabled us to connect with people from diverse backgrounds and simplify complex legal concepts for the common public. From a personal perspective, the experience contributed significantly to professional growth, particularly in terms of building confidence in public speaking and performance, especially for first-time participants. Moreover, observing the functioning of Legal Aid counselors at the stall provided valuable practical insight into how legal assistance is delivered on the ground, transforming theoretical knowledge into meaningful social impact. In conclusion, the event was a resounding success that seamlessly blended cultural expression with social responsibility. We express our sincere gratitude to the Legal Services Clinic, MAIMS, and the Delhi State Legal Services Authority for providing us with this enriching opportunity. The experience has not only enhanced our performance abilities but has also strengthened our commitment to the noble objective of ensuring “Access to Justice for All.”
