On 19 November 2025, BALLB, BBALLB second-year law students undertook an academic visit to the Supreme Court of India. The primary objective of the visit was to observe the functioning of the Court and to relate classroom learning on judicial procedures with their practical application at the highest judicial forum of the country. The expansive halls, constructed with marble and designed with architectural precision, reflected the dignity of the institution. Portraits of former Chief Justices of India adorned the walls, symbolizing the principle of stare decisis—the doctrine that mandates adherence to judicial precedents. Students were fortunate to witness the judicial proceedings in various courtrooms in batch of 5 students each. Observing these proceedings offered valuable insight into courtroom advocacy and judicial reasoning.

A significant part of the visit was the guided tour of the Supreme Court judges' library, a facility of remarkable size and sophistication. The Senior librarian informed that it is among the largest law libraries in Asia, housing more than **3,80,000** legal documents, including books, monographs, law reports, statutes etc. The library is meticulously organized and supported by advanced digital infrastructure. The visit also included a tour of the **National Judicial Museum and Archive (NJMA)**, an interactive and technologically advanced institution that offers a detailed exploration of India's judicial history. The museum incorporates modern digital tools to enhance visitor engagement. Spread across three floors, the museum showcases artefacts from ancient, medieval, and British periods. This academic visit effectively bridged the gap between theoretical legal education and its real-world application, offering students a profound and enriching understanding of the Supreme Court's role in the administration of justice.
