Mandeep Baisla from the Supreme Court of India, shared his expertise in how to build a successful carrier in litigation, offering invaluable insights tailored to the needs of budding law professionals.

The session with Advocate Mandeep Baisla provided students with valuable insights into building a successful career in litigation. Drawing from his extensive courtroom experience, he emphasized the importance of developing strong legal knowledge, client management skills, and applying widely for positions under experienced advocates. He advised young lawyers to handle their first few clients with utmost care, as these early experiences are often challenging

yet pivotal to professional growth. Addressing financial barriers, Adv. Baisla encouraged students to remain perseverant and dedicated, regardless of their starting circumstances.

Throughout the discussion, the speaker highlighted the significance of internships, mentorship, and regular court visits for gaining practical exposure. He shared real life examples to illustrate key aspects of cross-examination, client interaction, and courtroom conduct. For judiciary aspirants, he recommended completing the syllabus thoroughly, dedicating 2–3 hours to coaching and 7–8 hours of self study, and using landmark judgments to master legal sections. He also advised students to expand their internship opportunities through LinkedIn networking, professional references, and direct outreach to advocates.

The session concluded with a felicitation ceremony by Prof. (Dr.) Praveen Kumar Gupta, Head of the Department of Law. Students gained actionable insights on developing essential lawyering skills such as drafting, communication, and client briefing, along with the importance of perseverance and continuous self-improvement. The session proved highly beneficial, especially for first-generation lawyers, equipping them with practical guidance and motivation for future growth and success.
