The Department of Computer Applications, Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Management Studies, organised an Orientation Programme for the newly admitted BCA Batch 2026–30 on 5th August 2026. The programme was designed to provide students with a structured introduction to the Department, its academic environment, student activities, and opportunities for participation beyond the classroom. A total of 120 students participated in the programme. The orientation commenced with a warm welcome to the Head of the Department, faculty members and the newly admitted students. The programme was conducted in two shifts for morning shift and second shift. As reflected in the event poster, morning shift was scheduled from 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM and second shift from 11:00 AM to 12:00 PM. The programme was held in Room 957, 5th Floor, 9th Block.

The session began with an introduction to the Department of Computer Applications, acquainting students with the Department and its academic environment. A departmental video was subsequently screened to give the students a visual overview of the Department and its activities. This was followed by an address by the Head of the Department, Prof. (Dr.) Sarita Bansal Garg, who welcomed the students and provided guidance regarding their academic journey and engagement with the institute. A dedicated segment of the programme introduced the students to “Algorithms – The Tech Fusion Society”, the Department’s technical society. The students were familiarised with the purpose and activities of the society, followed by the screening of the Algorithms Society video. The segment highlighted opportunities for students to participate in technical, creative and collaborative activities during their BCA programme.

To make the orientation interactive and engaging, two activities were conducted: a Tech Quiz and Heads Up. The activities encouraged participation, quick thinking, teamwork and interaction among the freshers. The interactive component helped create a welcoming atmosphere and provided students with an opportunity to engage with their peers in an informal setting. The Orientation Programme successfully provided the incoming BCA students with an encouraging and informative start to their academic journey. By combining departmental orientation, faculty interaction, an introduction to the technical society, audio-visual presentations and interactive games, the programme fostered student engagement and helped create a sense of belonging. The participation of faculty members and student coordinators ensured that the programme was conducted in an organised and welcoming manner.
