On 1st September, 2026, BALLB, BBALLB, fourth-year law students undertook an academic visit to the Supreme Court of India. The primary objective of the visit was to observe the functioning of the court and to relate classroom learning on judicial procedures with their practical application at the highest judicial forum of the country. The expansive halls, constructed with marble and designed with architectural precision, reflected the dignity of the institution. Students were fortunate to witness the judicial proceedings in various courtrooms in batches of 5 students each. Observing these proceedings offered valuable insight into courtroom advocacy and judicial reasoning.

The visit also included the tour of the museum of the Supreme Court and the National Justice Museum and Archives (NJMA). There were three floors signifying the history: our chief justices till now, women who shaped our judicial system and the high courts of India. It was a complete blend of how technologically evolved the courts of India have become and the significance of the Supreme Court in shaping our judiciary. A significant part of the visit was the guided tour of the Supreme Court judge's library, a facility of remarkable size and sophistication. The senior librarian informed us that it is among the largest law libraries in Asia, housing more than 380,000 legal documents, including books, monographs, law reports, statutes, etc. The library is meticulously organised and supported by advanced digital infrastructure. In the end a documentary was shown on the judicial history of India, which summed up the visit in a very profound way.
